You are cordially invited to attend the Installation Court Lunch of the Worshipful Company of Water Conservators, at Stationers' Hall, Ave Maria Lane, London, EC4



The Stationers moved to the site of their present Hall in 1606 . The Hall was destroyed in the Great Fire in 1666. A new Hall was ready for use by 1673, with alterations and additions in 1776, 1825 and 1885. The Hall today is one of the most beautiful in London in spite of serious damage caused by enemy action in 1940. The Court Room was partially destroyed but was restored by 1957, and the ceiling of the Livery Hall had to be re-erected to a design of 1800

The Ceremony of Installation will commence at 11.40am and Reception drinks will be served from 12.15 to 12.40pm in the Gardens outside (however wet weather provisions have been made). Lunch will then commence followed and the traditional offering of the Stirrup Cup.

**The Guest speaker will be
Professor Michael Proctor FRS,
Provost of King's College Cambridge**

Michael Proctor grew up on a farm in Spalding, Lincolnshire. He was educated at Shrewsbury School, and read Mathematics at Trinity College Cambridge. After Part III Mathematics he spent a year at MIT as a Kennedy Scholar before returning to Cambridge to do research in cosmical magnetic fields. He became a Research Fellow of Trinity in 1974. He then spent two years on the Faculty at MIT before returning to Cambridge as Assistant Lecturer and teaching Fellow of Trinity in 1977. He was from 2000, until his retirement from the Chair, Professor of Astrophysical Fluid Dynamics. From 2006-2012 he was Vice-Master of Trinity College, Cambridge.



He became Provost of King's College, Cambridge, in 2013. His research is principally concerned with the generation of magnetic fields on the Sun, and their interaction with solar convection. He was elected to the Royal Society in 2006. He is a trustee of the Gladstone Memorial Trust and Governor of several secondary schools. His interests include gardening, rowing and blues and classical music. He lives with his wife Julia, a local GP, in Cambridge. He has three children and two stepchildren.
