As this month's PP goes to press, HMS SCOTT will have reached another important milestone in her journey from dry-dock to sea-going ship, as her new Captain, Commander Karen Dalton-Fyfe officially signed for the ship, taking responsibility for it and the Ship's Company.



Karen joined the Royal Navy in 1997 serving in a wide variety of ships, from modest minehunters up to the aircraft carrier Illustrious. This is Karen's second appointment to SCOTT, her first was as the Operations Officer 2005-06. Karen is married and lives in the South West.

SCOTT is starting the look and feel like a ship again. The Ship's Company have moved back onboard, the painters have nearly finished all the external decks & topsides, but most important of all, the Galley is back in action (see below).

As you read this, the dockyard is working a 24 hour shift pattern in order to attach the new rudder housing to the ship's hull after significant cracking was found in the original casing.

The plan is that the ship will be floated out of dry dock in the new year.
