Our Speaker

A solicitor by profession, Dame Glenys Stacey has a wealth of CEO and regulatory experience, having led the start-up or development of a number of public-sector organisations responsible for legal or regulatory services. She has previously served as Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of



Probation, Chief Executive at Animal Health (now part of the Animal and Plant Health Agency), chair of the Professional Standards Authority and Chief Regulator at Ofqual. In 2019, she chaired an independent review of farm regulation at the request of the then Secretary of State for Defra.

The OEP is working to ensure that our environment is not just protected properly but improved and enhanced. It is monitoring and enforcing compliance with environmental law by public authorities.

In June 2022 the OEP launched an investigation into the regulation of combined sewer overflows. In January 2023 it observed that none of the 23 environmental targets in the government's 25 Year Environment Plan were "demonstrably on track". In March it found the government was 'consistently failing' to complete reviews of environmental laws.

The Bakers' Company



The Bakers' Company can trace its origins back to 1155 and is the City of London's second oldest recorded guild. It continues to be closely involved with the baking trade and a high proportion of its members are Master Bakers or Allied Traders. The Company, 19th in the order of precedence, is one of the oldest City of London Liveries with a history dating back over 800 years. The first known records of the existence of the Bakers' Guild are contained in the great 'Pipe Rolls' of Henry II which listed the yearly 'farm' paid to the Crown. It is shown that the Bakers of London (the Bolengarii) paid a Mark of gold to the King's Exchequer for their Guild from 1155 AD onwards.
