Myddelton Lunch *Monday 23rd January 2023* *Trinity House*



Members of the Company are cordially invited to attend the Myddelton Lunch together with their partners, colleagues and friends for the 23rd anniversary of the grant of Livery to our Company.

Each year the Worshipful Company of Water Conservators celebrates the granting of Livery in the year 2000 and the life of Sir Hugh Myddelton, with a Service of Re-dedication followed by a Luncheon. The Service (at which the Company Cross is re-dedicated) will be led by the Company's Chaplain, Revd. Katherine Hedderly, Vicar, at All Hallows by the Tower at 11.00.

Following the Service, the Company will then process to Trinity House for the Myddelton Lunch.

It is hoped that you and your guests will attend both the Service and the Luncheon.

Reception drinks will be serviced from 12.15 to 12.40 at Trinity House followed by Lunch and the traditional offering of the Stirrup Cup.

The guest speaker will be

Rear Admiral Brian Perowne CB DL

Brian's distinguished naval career included service on the Royal Yacht Britannia, Commander of HMS Alacrity and of HMS Brazen, on the staff of the British Naval Attaché in Washington as Chief Naval Signals Officer, and finally Chief Executive of the Naval Bases and Supply Agency and on the Navy Board as Chief of Fleet Support. He is a 'Younger Brother' of Trinity House where our lunch is held. He was awarded Companion of the Order of the Bath in the New Year's Honours List in 2000.

Trinity House

Trinity House, headquarters for the lighthouse service, was built in 1796. It has a unique and elegant suite of rooms in a tranquil city location overlooking Trinity Square and the Tower of London. The present building was designed and constructed at the end of the 18th century and, in contrast to the Livery Halls more commonly associated with the City of London, has the look and feel of an elegant private residence. Furthermore, Trinity House reports not to the Lord Mayor of London, as the City Livery Companies do, but to the Sovereign.
